


FOGO WASTE COMES FULL CIRCLE TO MAKE COMPOST

Compost made from the contents of FOGO (Food Organics, Garden Organics) kerbside bins is now available for local residents to use. Bags of FOGO-derived compost will be up for grabs* for free at a number of community events over April and May.

- Sunday 10 April Freo Farmer's Market, Beaconsfield (8-12 noon)
- Saturday 30 April APACE Open Day, 1 Johannah Street, North Fremantle (9-1pm)
- Sunday 29 May Perth Maker's Market, Heathcote Reserve, Applecross (9.30am-3.30pm)

(*Residents will be asked to complete a short survey to receive a bag. The number of bags are limited and may run out before the end of the event. Limit of one bag per household.)



Kitchen and garden waste collected

The 3-bin FOGO system was introduced to residents in the City of Melville, City of Fremantle and Town of East Fremantle in 2019.

Households collect their food waste in a kitchen caddy. The caddy can be lined with a green compostable liner that is provided by each council. That, together with garden waste (leaves, twigs, grass clippings etc) and items such as tissues and food-soiled cardboard is then placed in 240L lime-green lidded FOGO bin.

The raw FOGO material is collected weekly from residents and transported to the FOGO Processing Facility (FPF) at the Resource Recovery Group's Canning Vale Centre for preprocessing. Here, it is sent through a slow-speed shredder to gently break open caddy liners, and then screened depending on size. Visible contamination is physically removed by pickers and a slow-speed trommel.

Processing of FOGO

Once FOGO material is pre-processed, it is sent to external FOGO composting partners, Purearth and GO Organics where it is composted over the next two months via windrows. It is then combined with other beneficial organic inputs to make various products such as compost, mulch or soil improver. These products are now available to purchase in bulk or in bags.

The 3-bin FOGO system provides residents with more options for separating their waste with the aim to improve recovery rates, increase diversion from landfill and reduce costs of processing material. Diverting organic waste also reduces the amount of harmful greenhouse gas (methane) that would usually be produced by organic waste breaking down in landfill.

BIN TAGGING PIN-POINTS COMMON CONTAMINANTS



Our 2022 bin tagging is currently underway, so now is a good time to reflect on our waste disposal habits.

Data from previous years bin tagging shows that soft plastics are a common contaminant found in yellow-lidded recycling bins. If it can be scrunched into a ball, then it is too soft for kerbside recycling!

While soft plastics don't belong in your yellow-lidded recycling bin, they can still be collected and recycled through the REDcycle bins at your local Coles or Woolworths.

Our bin tagging program helps to reduce the amount of contaminants being sent to our waste recovery centres and ultimately reduces the amount of waste being sent to landfills.

WA SINGLE USE PLASTICS BAN



To reduce plastic pollution, the WA Government is implementing a ban on certain plastic items, enforceable from 1 July 2022. It will be illegal to supply:

- Any plastic shopping bag (with handles)
- Disposable plastic straws and stirrers
- Disposable plastic cutlery
- Disposable plastic plates
- Disposable plastic bowls (without lids)
- Disposable plastic food containers (without lids)
- Expanded polystyrene food containers and trays
- (from 1 October 2022) Disposable plastic cups for cold drinks

Release of balloons will also be banned.

newsletter RECYCLE RIGHT THIS EASTER



This Easter, remember to collect Easter egg alfoil wrappers into a ball of at least 5cm in diameter (or about the size of a tennis ball) before popping it in your recycling bin. This way we can make sure the alfoil is correctly sorted by the machines that help to process our recycling, as small pieces might not be picked up!

Did you know cardboard and hard plastic Easter egg packaging can be placed in your yellow-lidded Recycling bin? Remember to:

- Flatten cartons and boxes to create space in the bin
- Try to remove sticky tape where possible
- Avoid boxes covered in glitter or textiles, as these cannot be recycled
- Take soft plastics (such as hot cross bun bags) to REDcycle. For a comprehensive list of what you can take to REDcycle head to redcycle.net.au/

SHORTLISTED FOR WASTE AWARDS

Resource Recovery Group and the Western Metropolitan Regional Council (WMRC) have jointly created a set of GREAT waste education games and School Waste Education Day. The consortium submitted an application for the 2022 WasteSorted Awards and are excited to find out that it has been shortlisted in two categories: Category 1 – 2022 Community Waste Award and Category 6 – 2022 Local Government Award.
