




Bin Collection Map



- Ensure bins are placed out by 6am on collection day
- Your Food Organics, Garden Organics (FOGO) bin is collected weekly
- Your Recycling and General Waste bins are collected on alternate fortnights
- Do not overfill your bins and ensure lids are firmly closed so items do not spill out
- Bins must weigh less than 70kg to be collected

- Please place your waste on the verge by 6am Monday on the scheduled start date as the contractor will only service your verge for Green Waste or Bulk/Whitegoods once.



Important information for Verge Collections

GREEN WASTE COLLECTIONS

The following items WILL be collected:

Tree and shrub prunings up to

- ✓ 1.5 metres in length
- ✓ 300mm in diameter
- ✓ Two trailer loads (6x4 trailer) size) or 2 cubic metres of green waste

The following items **WILL NOT** be collected:

- X NO bags or boxes of leaves. loose leaves or grass clippings
- X NO dug out lawn NO sand and soil materials
- X NO general rubbish, bulk or white goods
- X NO weeds and root materials

BULK & WHITE GOODS / METAL COLLECTIONS

The following Items WILL be collected:

- General bulk waste
- Mattresses (collection may occur a day after general bulk waste)
- ✓ Scrap (furniture & other household items)
- ✓ Timber products (up to) 1.5 metres in length)
- White goods (fridges.) stoves etc, up to 1.5 metres in length)

The following Items WILL NOT be collected:

Details on how to present verge waste:

- ✓ Place away from walls, fences and power poles
- Separate white goods, steel and e-waste from other verge collection goods
- ✓ Keep checking your pile to ensure compliance
- X Do not place under trees or over sprinklers
- X Do not place any items on vacant land or in any park land as penalties apply for illegal dumping
- X Do not place on footpaths and driveways
- X Do not follow your neighbour; CHECK COLLECTION DATES first
- X Non-compliance will result in NO COLLECTION.




The waste collected in your vellow topped Recycle bin is taken to the Regional Resource Recovery Centre in Canning Vale where items are sorted and separated into different waste streams. Improve the rates of recovery by preventing forms of contaminants entering into your Recycling bin.


What goes in the Recycling bin?



Glass Bottles and Jars:

- ✓ Beer bottles
- Broken glass (not mirrors)
- ✓ Coffee jars
- Sauce and wine bottles (lids off)





- ✓ Plastic containers from kitchen (rinsed and clean) i.e. sauce bottles
- Plastic containers from laundry (rinsed and clean)
 i.e. detergent bottles
- ✔ Plastic containers from bathroom (rinsed and clean) i.e. shampoo bottles
- ✓ Take-away food containers (not polystyrene)



Paper and Cardboard:

- ✓ Cardboard (flattened)
- ✓ Paper (not shredded)
- ✓ Letters and junk mail

Steel and Aluminium Cans:

- ✓ Aluminium cans
- ✓ Coffee and Milo tins
- ✓ Jar lids
- ✓ Food tins (rinsed)

What goes in the General Waste bin? (COLLECTED FORTNIGHTLY)

Your General Waste bin is collected fortnightly and sent to the SUEZ transfer station in Bibra Lake. The General Waste bin is for all items that cannot be composted or recycled. Waste from your General Waste bin is sent to landfill.

Your General Waste Bin is for:

- ✓ Nappies and hygiene products
- Soft plastics and packaging (bread bags, chip packets, lolly wrappers)
- ✓ Polystyrene
- ✓ All meat trays
- ✓ All coffee cups and coffee pods
- ✓ Long life cartons (tetrapaks)



These items don't belong in this bin:



NO aerosol cans or gas bottles



NO batteries or electronic waste



NO food waste



NO garden waste



NO recyclables

What goes in the General Waste bin?



Plastic bags:

- ✔ Plastic liners and bags can only go in the General Waste bin
- All damaged textiles and fabric including shoes
- ✓ Cigarettes
- ✓ Plastic bottle lids
- ✓ Long life cartons (Tetrapaks)
- ✓ Garden hose and rope



Polystyrene & Soft Plastic:

- All polystyrene packaging
- ✓ Meat trays (all)
- ✓ Coffee cups (all)
- ✓ Coffee pods
- ✓ Soft plastic (OR to REDcycle)



Nappies:

- ✓ Nappies should always go in the General Waste bin
- ✓ Baby wipes



Hygiene Products:

✓ All personal care and hygiene products must go in the general waste bin

Preferably take all your soft plastic e.g. bread bags, chip packets and plastic bags to REDcycle bins at major supermarkets. For more information on REDcycle see **redcycle.net.au**

Fremantle Recycling Centre

The Town of East Fremantle has partnered with the City of Fremantle to allow all East Fremantle residents to access the Fremantle Recycle Centre, free of charge. To access the facility please bring photo ID showing your residential address (e.g. driver's licence) with your rates notice or a bill. To drop off unrecyclable Bulk Waste, remember your Fremantle Recycle voucher letter.

The Fremantle Recycle Centre is located on Montreal Street in Fremantle, opposite the golf course.

Opening times:

- The standard opening hours for the Fremantle Recycle Centre are listed below, however please check online at fremantle.wa.gov.au or call the City of Fremantle on 1300 693 736 for current operating times.
- Friday 12 noon-4pm
- Saturday and Sunday 8am-4pm, excluding public holidays



The recycling centre accepts:

- Mobile phones

- Motor oil
- ✓ One trailer load (6 x 4 trailer size) of clean green waste including shrub and tree prunings up to 1.5mm in length and 30cm in diameter
- ✓ Paint
- ✓ Polystyrene
- ✓ Printer cartridges
- Recycling the same materials that go in your yellow-topped bin
- ✓ Scrap metal
- ✓ Tyres (\$20.10 each)
- ✓ Up to 100L of paint
- ✓ Whitegoods



The recycling centre does not accept:

- X Acids, cleaners or bleaches
- **X** Asbestos
- X Hardy fence
- **X** Medicine

- ✗ Mixed general waste, bags or boxes of rubbish
- **X** Poisons or chemicals
- X Sand, soil, concrete or rocks
- X Wood off-cuts or timber

Charges may apply for non-recyclable items.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) includes unwanted household products that contain chemicals or substances that can be harmful to you, your family, your pets or the environment. They can also be harmful to staff at the waste processing facility if they are not disposed of correctly.

Items accepted include:

Acids and Alkalis

Flares

- Batteries (household)
- Fire Extinguishers (red only)
- Fluorescent Tubes
- Gas cylinders

Paint

- Household Cleaners
- Pesticides/Herbicides
- Pool Chemicals
- Smoke Detectors
- Unknown Chemicals



Only domestic quantities (no more than 20kg/l) of HHW will be accepted for free at HHW disposal sites.

AEROSOL CANS (EMPTY)

A collection bin for recycling of empty aerosol cans is available at Fremantle Recycling Centre. Alternatively please drop empty aerosol cans at a HHW facility as above.

ASBESTOS, CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION (C&D) & HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW):

Asbestos and Construction and Demolition waste can be disposed of for a fee at the following disposal sites:
