

## **Bin Collection Map**



- Ensure bins are placed out by 6am on collection day
- Your Food Organics, Garden Organics (FOGO) bin is collected weekly
- Your Recycling and General Waste bins are collected on **alternate fortnights**
- Do not overfill your bins and ensure lids are firmly closed so items do not spill out
- Bins must weigh less than 70kg to be collected



### Important information for Verge Collections

#### **GREEN WASTE COLLECTIONS**

## The following items WILL be collected:

Tree and shrub prunings up to

- ✓ 1.5 metres in length
- ✓ 300mm in diameter
- Two trailer loads (6x4 trailer size) or 2 cubic metres of green waste

## The following items WILL NOT be collected:

- NO bags or boxes of leaves, loose leaves or grass clippings
- X NO dug out lawn NO sand and soil materials
- NO general rubbish, bulk or white goods
- × NO weeds and root materials



#### **BULK & WHITE GOODS / METAL COLLECTIONS**

## The following Items WILL be collected:

- ✓ General bulk waste
- Mattresses (collection may occur a day after general bulk waste)
- Scrap (furniture & other household items)
- Timber products (up to 1.5 metres in length)
- ✓ White goods (fridges, stoves etc, up to 1.5 metres in length)

#### The following Items WILL NOT be collected:

- × NO asbestos products
- X NO batteries
- × NO bricks, sand or building rubble
- × NO car bodies or vehicle parts
- X NO cement or concrete
- X NO dug out lawn
- X NO furniture including glass panels
- X NO food waste or domestic rubbish
- NO gas cylinders

- X NO green waste, no bags with leaves
- × NO paints, chemicals, oils
- NO plate glass or shower screens
- × NO stumps or palm logs
- × NO trees
- × NO tyres

## What goes in the Recycling bin? (COLLECTED FORTNIGHTLY)

The waste collected in your yellow topped Recycle bin is taken to the Regional Resource Recovery Centre in Canning Vale where items are sorted and separated into different waste streams.





### These items don't belong in this bin:



NO soiled containers



NO aerosol cans or gas bottles



NO polystyrene or soft plastics



NO batteries or electronic waste



NO ropes, cables or hose



NO clothes or textiles



NO tied bags or liners

## What goes in the Recycling bin?



## Glass Bottles and Jars:

- ✓ Beer bottles
- Broken glass (not mirrors)
- ✓ Coffee jars
- ✓ Sauce and wine bottles (lids off)





- ✔ Plastic containers from kitchen (rinsed and clean) i.e. sauce bottles
- Plastic containers from laundry (rinsed and clean) i.e. detergent bottles
- Plastic containers from bathroom (rinsed and clean) i.e. shampoo bottles
- Take-away food containers (not polystyrene)



#### Paper and Cardboard:

- Cardboard (flattened)
- Paper (not shredded)
- ✓ Letters and junk mail



#### **Steel and Aluminium Cans:**

- Aluminium cans
- ✓ Coffee and Milo tins
- ✓ Jar lids
- ✓ Food tins (rinsed)

## The Recycling Bin

## What goes in the General Waste bin? (COLLECTED FORTNIGHTLY)

Your General Waste bin is collected fortnightly and the contents sent to landfill. The General Waste bin is for most items that cannot be composted or recycled.

#### Your General Waste Bin is for:

- ✓ Nappies and hygiene products
- Soft plastics and packaging (bread bags, chip packets, lolly wrappers)
- ✓ Polystyrene
- ✓ All meat trays
- ✓ All coffee cups and coffee pods
- ✓ Long life milk and juice cartons (tetrapaks)



### These items don't belong in this bin:



NO aerosol cans or gas bottles



NO batteries or electronic waste



NO food waste



NO garden waste



NO clean recyclables

### What goes in the General Waste bin?



#### Plastic bags:

- ✓ Plastic liners and bags can only go in the General Waste bin
- All damaged textiles and fabric including shoes
- ✓ Cigarettes
- ✓ Plastic bottle lids
- ✓ Long life cartons (Tetrapaks)
- ✓ Garden hose and rope



### Nappies:

- Nappies should always go in the General Waste bin
- ✓ Baby wipes



## Polystyrene & Soft Plastic:

- All polystyrene packaging
- ✓ Meat trays (all)
- ✓ Coffee cups (all)
- ✓ Coffee pods
- ✓ Soft plastic (OR take to REDcycle)



#### **Hygiene Products:**

✓ All personal care and hygiene products must go in the general waste bin

Preferably take all your soft plastic e.g. bread bags, chip packets and plastic bags to REDcycle bins at major supermarkets. For more information on REDcycle and to find your closest drop off location, visit **redcycle.net.au** 

### Fremantle Recycling Centre

City of Fremantle Recycling Centre is located on Montreal Street in Fremantle, opposite the golf course.

The Recycling Centre is free to all City of Fremantle residents - to access the facility please bring photo ID showing your residential address (e.g. driver's licence) with your rates notice or a bill. To drop off unrecyclable bulky waste, remember your voucher letter. Commercial business and commercial quantities are not accepted.

#### **Opening times:**

- Friday 12 noon-4pm
- Saturday and Sunday 8am-4pm, excluding public holidays



#### The recycling centre accepts:

- ✓ Cardboard
- ✓ Clean and unbroken blocks, bricks and pavers
- ✓ Electronic waste and electrical. cables (no smoke detectors)
- ✓ Fire extinguishers (red only)
- Fluorescent bulbs and tubes
- Gas bottles
- ✓ Good quality clothing, shoes and bags for charity
- Mattresses and bases (\$33.50 charge per item)
- Mobile phones

- including shrub and tree prunings up to 1.5m in length and 30cm in diameter ✓ Paint (up to 100L)
  - ✓ Polystyrene
  - Printer cartridges
  - Recycling the same materials that go in your yellow-topped bin

✓ One trailer load (6 x 4 trailer size) per day of clean green waste

- ✓ Scrap metal
- ✓ Tyres (\$20.10 each)
- ✓ Whitegoods



### The recycling centre does not currently accept the below items, however keep an eye on our website for updates:

### **Containers for Change**

#### What is Containers for Change?

Containers for Change is Western Australia's new container deposit scheme. Containers for Change will provide a 10cent refund for each eligible container returned for recycling at an approved Containers for Change Refund Point, encouraging recycling and creating a cleaner WA for everyone.

## When will Containers for Change commence in Fremantle?

Fremantle Recycling Centre's refund point will open its doors on **Thursday 1 October 2020** with the launch of Containers for Change across Western Australia. The refund point is located on **Montreal Street, Fremantle**, opposite the golf course.

## Why do we need Containers for Change?

Containers for Change will reduce litter, reduce landfill and improve recycling in Western Australia.

Beverage containers make up 44% of all litter in Western Australia (by volume, 2017-18 National Litter Index), even though they are made from easily recyclable materials such as glass, plastic, aluminium and cardboard. To help encourage more Western Australians to collect and return these containers, Containers for Change will provide a 10-cent refund for each container that is returned

Containers for Change also provides an exciting fundraising opportunity for schools, local sports clubs, community groups, charities and worthwhile causes; the scheme will also create hundreds of iobs across Western Australia.

How will Containers for Change work?
Return your eligible containers to the Fremantle Recycling Centre's Refund Point on Montreal Street for a 10c refund. Eligible containers can also be donated at Donation Points set up by local community groups, charities or not-for-profit organisations. Containers can be returned by individuals or organisations, and any number of containers can be returned at one time, providing the given Refund Point has the capacity to accept them.

## Which containers are eligible for a refund?

The scheme targets beverage containers most commonly seen as litter.

Most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paperboard beverage containers between 150ml and 3L are eligible for a refund.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) includes unwanted household products that contain chemicals or substances that can be harmful to you, your family, your pets or the environment. They can also be harmful to staff at the waste processing facility if they are not disposed of correctly.

- Batteries (household)
- Fire Extinguishers (red only)
- Flares
- Fluorescent Tubes
- Gas cylinders

- Household Cleaners
- Paint
- Pesticides/Herbicides
- Pool Chemicals
- Smoke Detectors
- Unknown Chemicals

Only domestic quantities (no more than 20kg/l) of HHW will be accepted for free at HHW disposal sites. **Keep an eye on the Fremantle Recycling Centre website for changes to items accepted at the centre from October.** 

#### **AEROSOL CANS (EMPTY)**

A collection bin for recycling of empty aerosol cans is available at Fremantle Recycling Centre. Alternatively, please drop empty aerosol cans at a HHW facility as above.

**ASBESTOS, CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION (C&D) WASTE:** Asbestos and Construction & Demolition waste can be disposed of for a fee at the following disposal sites:
