General Waste Bin - Collected weekly



Your **General Waste Bin** is for all general rubbish items, such as:

- ✓ Dog poo & kitty litter
 ✓ Food waste
- ✓ General rubbish items
 ✓ Hygiene products
- ✓ Nappies ✓ Plastic bags
- ✓ Polystyrene & soft plastic
- × NO clean recyclables
- × NO hazardous waste

Household Hazardous Waste and E-waste shouldn't be placed into any bins because they can be dangerous. Soft Plastics

Soft plastics can't go in your recycling bin. You can collect your soft plastics and drop them in a REDcycle bin located at major supermarkets for recycling. For more information visit www.redcycle.net.au



Soft plastics are more than plastic bags. Did you know these items are accepted by REDcycle?

- · Bubble wrap
- Cellophane from bunches of flowers
- · Chip and cracker packets (silver lined)
- · Confectionery and pasta bags
- Netting produce bags (metal clips removed)
- Pet food pouches and bags
- Plastic Australia Post satchels
- Potting mix and compost bags
- Squeeze pouches with lid on (e.g. yoghurt/baby food)



Please make sure your plastic is EMPTY and DRY

Containers for Change



Whether you're keen to earn a bit of extra cash, raise money for your local sports club or event, or donate to your favourite charity, you can start earning 10 cents for every eligible drink container collected.

All drink containers returned through the scheme are recycled into new items such as glass bottles.

What's in? Acceptable beverage containers include most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paper board between 150ml and 3 litres. You can recycle lids from these containers too, remember to remove them first!



GREEN WASTE COLLECTIONS

Up to one cubic metre of the following items WILL be collected:

- Bag leaves and small vegetation
- ✓ Green waste branches, cuttings and leaves (Max length 1.5 metres & max diameter 150mm)



Green Waste bags – for small cuttings can be purchased from the Town's Administration building for \$5.50 each

The following Items WILL NOT be collected:

- X Branches over 1.5 metres in length
- X Branches over 200mm in diameter
- X Bulk or household waste
- Leaves in plastic bags
- X Large tree trunks or stumps

BULK VERGE WASTE COLLECTIONS

The following items WILL be collected:

 General junk items longer than 1.2 meters in length need to be dismantled e.g. swingsets, playgrounds, trampolines



- Old furniture
- Refrigerators (doors removed) & other white goods
- Stoves (doors removed)

The following items WILL NOT be collected:

- X Asbestos & cement product
- Bricks, concrete, sand & rubble
- Building materials, timber & tiles
- Car batteries
