## **FOGO Kitchen Caddy & Token Information**

**There are many ways you can use your FOGO Kitchen Caddy to collect organics for composting:**

### **Go Nude**



Food scraps can go straight into your kitchen caddy and FOGO bin. Simply wash your kitchen caddy after emptying. Using a sheet of paper towel or newspaper in the bottom of the caddy will help to soak up liquids.

### **Newspaper**

Wrap food scraps in newspaper or use it to line your kitchen caddy. You can even make an origami liner which would be a great project for the kids!



## Redeem Tokens for Compostable Liners

Each token provided on the front of this calendar can be exchanged for one pack of 75 compostable liners at a time from the City of Melville Civic Centre, AH Bracks Library, Civic Square Library, Willagee Library, Bull Creek Library, Blue Gum Community Centre or City of Melville Operations Centre.

### Purchase Compostable Liners

You can buy compostable liners from Woolworths, Coles, FoodWorks and Bunnings or online from Cardia Bioproducts, Compost-A-Pak and BioBag World. Only buy compostable liners that display the Certified Australian Standard logos and numbers.



### Compostable vs Biodegradable

"Compostable" means made from 100% plant materials which are suitable for composting.

"Biodegradable" means it breaks down into micro-plastics, which are harmful to the environment and contaminate the FOGO compost.

## Pet Poo Options

City supplied compostable liners are designed for your kitchen caddy and food scraps only.

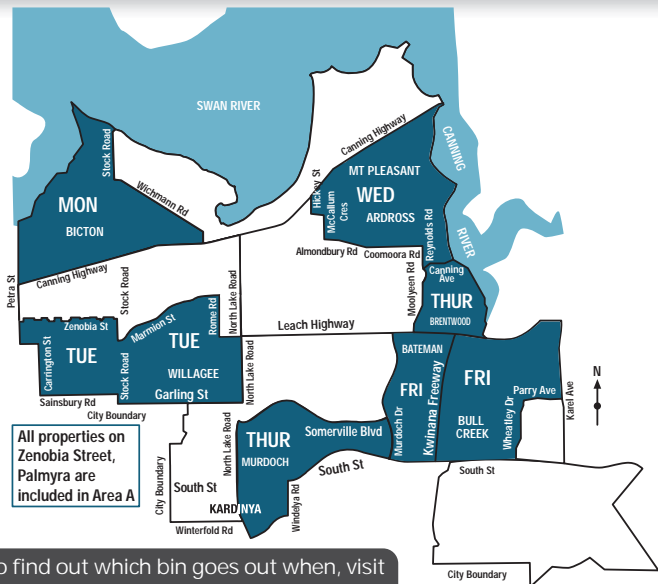
To dispose of pet poo:

- Put pet poo and kitty litter straight into your FOGO bin
- Purchase compostable pet poo bags from Woolworths, Bunnings, Petbarn, your local pet store or online from Compost-A-Pak, Cardia Bioproducts and BioBag World
- Set up a pet poo composter at home such as EnsoPet or a Bokashi System.

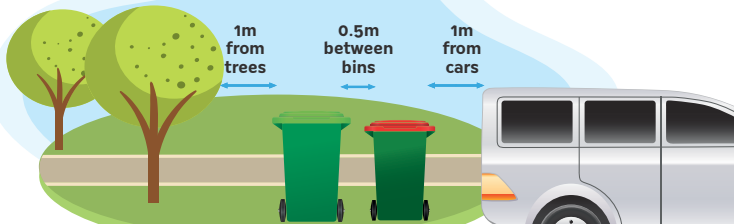

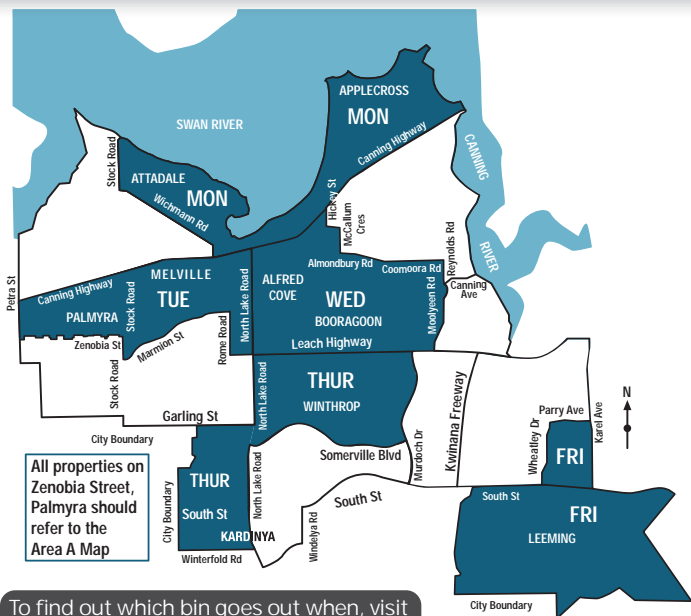

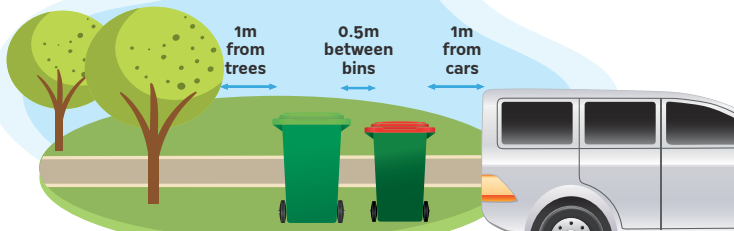

# Which Bin Do I Put It In?

**FOGO** – Collected weekly



- ✓ **All food waste:** including meat, bones, dairy and seafood
- ✓ **Tea bags and coffee grounds**
- ✓ **Compostable liners**
- ✓ **Garden waste:** Lawn clippings, branches, flowers, weeds and leaves
- ✓ **Animal waste:** Kitty litter and dog poo
- ✓ **Dirty Takeaway Paper and Cardboard:** including greasy pizza boxes, takeaway containers, paper bags and paper plates
- ✓ **Shredded paper**
- ✓ **Tissues, napkins and paper towels**
- ✓ **Wooden pop sticks and cutlery**

**These items don't belong in the FOGO bin:**



**NO plastic bags or liners**

- ✓ **Soft plastic\*** (bags, packets and wrappers)
- ✓ **Ceramics**
- ✓ **All polystyrene packaging**
- ✓ **Plastic bottle lids**
- ✓ **Long life cartons** (Tetra Pak)
- ✓ **All meat trays and packaging**
- ✓ **All coffee cups and coffee pods**
- ✓ **Cigarette butts**
- ✓ **Pill packets**
- ✓ **All nappies, hygiene products and wipes**
- ✓ **All damaged textiles** (including shoes)

## Recycling bin – Collected fortnightly



Please ensure all recycling is clean, dry and empty, placed loosely in the bin (not in bags). Lids must be removed and placed in the general waste bin.



- ✓ **Glass:** Beer, wine, spirit and juice bottles, jars and broken glass
- ✓ **Hard plastics:** Plastic containers from the kitchen, laundry and bathroom (sauce bottles, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles, plastic takeaway food containers)
- ✓ **Paper and Cardboard:** Cardboard (flattened), paper (not shredded), egg cartons, letters and junk mail
- ✓ **Steel and aluminium:** Cans, tins, metal jar lids, scrunched aluminium foil (size of a tennis ball) and metal cooking oil containers (under 5L only)

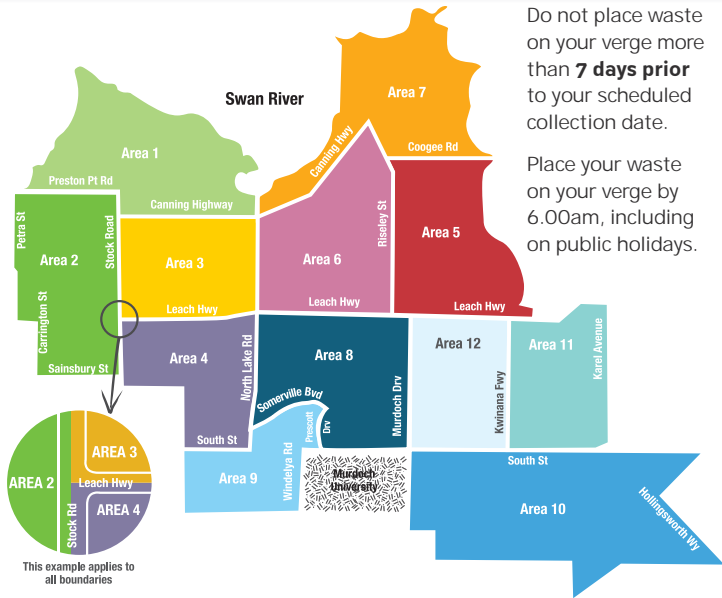
### These items don't belong in the Recycling bin:



Hazardous items, such as aerosols, batteries, chemicals, E-Waste, gas cylinders, light globes, paint and motor oil, can be dangerous, causing fires in waste trucks and at recycling facilities. ## Verge Waste Dos and Don'ts

- ✓ Place neatly on verge no more than 7 days prior to collection
- ✓ Place away from trees, walls, fences, sprinklers, vehicles etc.
- ✓ Keep checking your pile to ensure compliance
- ✓ Allow 7 working days for collection from scheduled collection date
- ✗ **DO NOT** obstruct footpaths, driveways or your normal bin services
- ✗ **DO NOT** place items on vacant land, public reserves or commercial property – penalties apply for illegal dumping
- ✗ **DO NOT** place commercial waste on your verge or place waste on commercial property verges – they will not be collected
- ✗ **DO NOT** follow your neighbour – check collection dates first

**Waste will not be collected if it does not conform or is placed out late. Removal then becomes the responsibility of the resident.**

## Garden Organics

**The following items **WILL** be collected:**

- ✓ Up to 2 cubic metres
- ✓ Prunings up to 1.5 metres in length and 35 centimetres in diameter
- ✓ Items placed loosely on the verge, not in bags or boxes

**The following items **WILL NOT** be collected:**

- ✗ **NO** leaves, lawn clippings, weeds or roots (place in FOGO bin)
- ✗ **NO** dug out lawn, sand or soil materials
- ✗ **NO** general waste, bulk or white goods
- ✗ **NO** treated wood
- ✗ **NO** bagged or boxed items

**Garden organics will not be collected on the behalf of contractors. Only residential green waste is accepted.**

**The following items **WILL NOT** be collected:**

- ✗ **NO** batteries
- ✗ **NO** bean bags or polystyrene balls
- ✗ **NO building materials:** bricks, tiles, sand, cement, insulation, plasterboard, concrete, asbestos or fencing
- ✗ **NO** car bodies, parts or tyres
- ✗ **NO glass:** mirrors, windows, furniture with glass panels, screens or fish tanks
- ✗ **NO** gas cylinders, aerosols or fire extinguishers
- ✗ **NO** garden organics
- ✗ **NO** paints, chemicals or oils

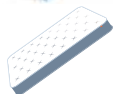
