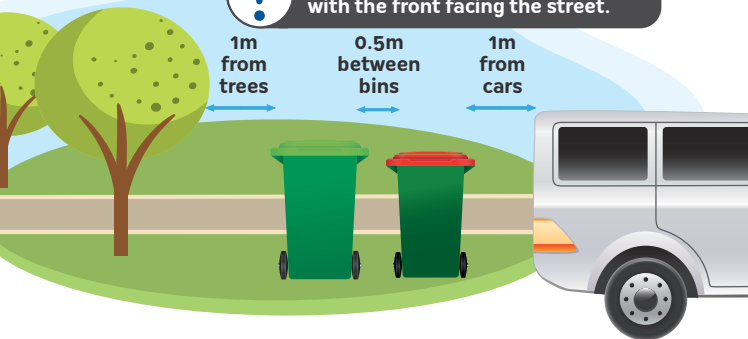

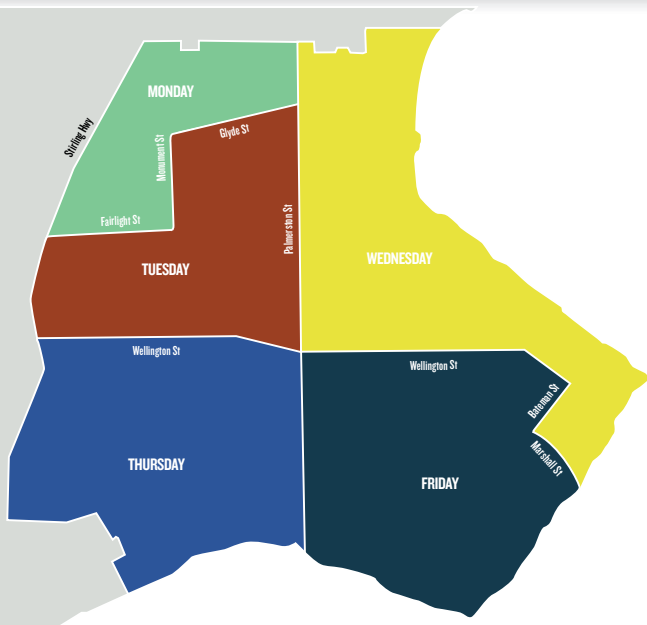

- ✗ NO aerosols
- ✗ NO batteries or E-Waste
- ✗ NO meat trays
- ✗ NO nappies
- ✗ NO recycling in bags
- ✗ NO soft plastics

- ✗ NO textiles



Please ensure all recycling is clean, dry, empty with all lids removed and placed loose into the bin and not in bags

## General Waste Bin – Collected weekly



Your **General Waste Bin** is for all general rubbish items, such as:

- ✓ Dog poo & kitty litter
- ✓ Food waste
- ✓ General rubbish items
- ✓ Hygiene products
- ✓ Nappies
- ✓ Plastic bags
- ✓ Polystyrene & soft plastic
- ✗ NO clean recyclables
- ✗ NO hazardous waste

Household Hazardous Waste and E-waste shouldn't be placed into any bins because they can be dangerous. ## Frequently Asked Questions

### How do I book Verge Valet?

Simply book online via the 'Make a Booking' tab on the Verge Valet website [www.vergevalet.com.au](http://www.vergevalet.com.au). Having trouble? Call the Verge Valet and Recycling Hotline on 9384 6711.

### How far in advance do I need to book?

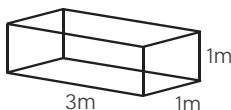
Bookings need to be made by the Thursday before your collection date. Collections are scheduled for Mondays in Mosman Park. Simply book online and select from the displayed dates.

### What can I put out for a Verge Valet collection?

**Up to 2  
Bulk Waste  
collections**

**1 Green  
Waste  
collection**

**Limit of 3m<sup>3</sup> per collection**



**You can change your bulk waste collections into green waste if you prefer**



**Verge Valet is intended for items that can no longer be used. Donate items that are too good to be thrown away.**

### What won't be accepted?

Asbestos, batteries, building materials, household hazardous waste, glass panels, pesticides, paint and vehicle parts. Drop these items off at the West Metro Recycling Centre 7 days a week – some are free and some for a fee. See the West Metro Recycling Centre section of this guide for details.

### Help – I need to change my booking!

You can change, cancel, or postpone your booking up to **one business day** before your collection date. Click the CHANGE A BOOKING tab on [www.vergevalet.com.au](http://www.vergevalet.com.au) or phone the Verge Valet Collection Team on 6336 7223. **Please give at least one business day's notice** or you will lose your collection allocation.

### What happens to the waste collected by Verge Valet?

Neat piles of separated waste help us recycle as much as we can. We reprocess all the greenwaste and recover as much recyclable material from bulk waste as possible. Mattresses, e-waste and white goods are recycled by specialists and fridges etc. are safely de-gassed.

## Item beyond repair? Too much greenwaste?

Verge Valet™ replaces the traditional bulk verge and green waste collection, giving you year-round access to verge waste collections at a time convenient to you.

### Three Easy Steps






1. Book online – [vergevalet.com.au](http://vergevalet.com.au)
2. Put waste out up to 3 days before waste collection.
3. LEAVE THE REST TO US! Verge Valet will collect and recycle what they can.

Sort first and treat your general waste bin as a last resort.

## G = GIFT

Gift items to charity, swap or sell.

## R = RECYCLE

Recycle these 5 in your yellow-lidded bin – clean, dry, lids off containers.



## E = EARTHCYCLE

Compost food scraps and garden waste. Worm Farming and Composting Factsheets available at [wmrc.wa.gov.au](http://wmrc.wa.gov.au)

## A = AVOID

## T = TAKE

Take hazardous and E-waste items to drop-off points. The West Metro Recycling Centre is a registered drop off point for the Household Hazardous Waste Program.

## Soft Plastics

Soft plastics can't go in your recycling bin. You can collect your soft plastics and drop them in a REDcycle bin located at major supermarkets for recycling. For more information visit [www.redcycle.net.au](http://www.redcycle.net.au)



Soft plastics are more than plastic bags. Did you know these items are accepted by REDcycle?

- Bubble wrap
- Cellophane from bunches of flowers
- Chip and cracker packets (silver lined)
- Confectionery and pasta bags
- Netting produce bags (metal clips removed)
- Pet food pouches and bags
- Plastic Australia Post satchels
- Potting mix and compost bags
- Squeeze pouches with lid on (e.g. yoghurt/baby food)



**Please make sure your plastic is EMPTY and DRY**

# Containers for Change



Whether you're keen to earn a bit of extra cash, raise money for your local sports club or event, or donate to your favourite charity, you can start earning 10 cents for every eligible drink container collected.

All drink containers returned through the scheme are recycled into new items such as glass bottles.

What's in? **Acceptable beverage containers include most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paper board between 150ml and 3 litres.** You can recycle lids from these containers too, remember to remove them first!

## **INELIGIBLE CONTAINERS**



Containers not commonly found in litter, including all plain milk, flavoured milks 1L and above, pure juice drinks, wine and spirit bottles, cordials.
