Recycling & General Waste Bin Collection

Your recycling collection will occur on the same day as your general waste collection.

You will need to know what Zone you are in. Zones are as follows:

Your general waste bin (red-topped) is collected weekly.



Your recycling bin (yellow-topped) is collected fortnightly – please check the cover for your date.

Residential Waste

- By showing proof of residency, residents can access either site for free disposal of general housing waste, bulk household waste & recyclables only.
- Commercial waste can be taken to the Muchea site with proof of residency. ***fees apply to dispose of commercial waste***
- Asbestos is only accepted at the Bindoon Landfill by appointment only. Charges apply. Please call the Shire office on 95764600 to make an appointment.
- Waste will not be accepted from outside the Shire of Chittering.

Liquid Waste Disposal

The Shire of Chittering does not have the ability to accept septage waste from leach drains & grease traps. All septage waste is subject to the Department of Water & Environmental Regulation controlled waste regulations & must only be transported by licensed contractor to an appropriate site.

Recycling at Waste Management Facilities

The Shire of Chittering offers a range of recycling options at both its waste management facilities. These include:

- Domestic recyclables – Glass bottles/jars, cardboard, aluminum & steel cans & tins.
- Scrap steel, de-gassed fridges, car bodies.
- Car batteries.
- Waste oil – also available to be taken to the Wannamal Transfer Station.
- E-Waste – TVs, computers, laptops, printers etc.
- Drum muster – only accepted at Bindoon Landfill.

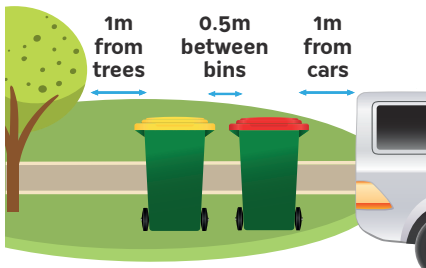
Take care of your bins as they can be easily damaged without your proper care, and bins deserve to be cared for after dealing with your rubbish.

Using Your Bins

BIN PLACEMENT

To assist waste and recycling operators in servicing your bin on collection day:

- Bins should be placed within 1 metre of the road kerb by 6.00am on collection day, with the handles facing towards the property. Ensure your bin does not block footpaths or driveways.
- Place your yellow recycling bin at least half a metre from the red bin to allow clear access for the side loading service vehicle's grab arm.
- Please do not overfill your bin as the rubbish and recycling trucks' hydraulics cannot lift bins weighing over 70kg, or those overfull with the lid open. Hot or burning ash, liquid wastes, oil, paint, solvents or heavy materials must not be placed in your bin as they may damage the bin, waste collection vehicle and the environment.
- Your bin lid must close so that the contents do not spill when it is lifted and so the lid does not blow open causing street litter.
- Place your bin clear of parked cars, trees, poles, etc to allow clear access to the service vehicles.
- Only waste placed inside the bin will be collected.



Ensure bins are placed out by 6am on collection day



Bins must weigh less than 70kg to be collected



Do not overfill your bins and ensure lids are firmly closed so items do not spill out

HANDY HINTS

- Return bins to your property as soon as possible.
- Store bins in a shaded area.
- Please clean your bin regularly.



YOUR RECYCLING BIN (YELLOW-TOPPED)

Contents from your yellow-topped bin, **collected fortnightly**, are sorted and baled at the Regional Resource Recovery Centre (RRRC) and sold for reprocessing.

Items should be LOOSE (not in plastic bags), rinsed and empty.

This includes:

- ✓ **Cardboard** – Flattened
- ✓ **Glass bottles and jars** – Clean and empty
- ✓ **Paper** – Not shredded
- ✓ **Plastic bottles and containers** – Clean and empty (no lids)
- ✓ **Steel and aluminium cans** – Clean and empty

YOUR WASTE BIN (RED-TOPPED)

Contents from your waste bin (red-topped), **collected weekly**, are disposed at a landfill site. To reduce your impact on the environment, please consider composting or worm farming food and garden organics at home. Visit **recycleright.wa.gov.au** for more information on how to get started.

✗ **NO Batteries**

Batteries are accepted at the Muchea and Bindoon sites.

✗ **NO Hazardous waste:** including petrol, gas cylinders, paints, motor oils & fluids, garden chemicals & poisons, pool chemicals, cleaners, aerosol cans, acids, bleaches & ammonia, medicines & flammable liquids.

✗ **NO Medical wastes or needles.**

✗ **NO Construction, demolition & building materials** (including bricks, sand, soil, concrete, rocks and asbestos).

Mulch Locations

At various times of the year, pending availability, mulch is available for purchase at the Muchea Landfill.

To purchase mulch, contact the Shire office on 95764600 to arrange a booking.



BOOKINGS ARE ESSENTIAL. To ensure a machine is available on site to load mulch into the trailer.

Mulch is sold at \$12.50m³. Please bring your own trailer.

Other Items

AUTOMOTIVE PRODUCTS If you have automotive products (coolants, brake pads, motor oil and tyres), discuss the right way to get rid of them with your mechanic or car service provider.

BOOKS, CLOTHING, FURNITURE, SHOES, BRIC-A-BRAC Please do not throw out household goods. There is a major need for clean, undamaged, reusable furniture which may be collected FREE of charge. Contact your local charity.

COMPACT FLUORESCENT TUBES (CFL) recycling boxes are available at each of the landfill sites.

COMPUTERS AND IT Old computer and IT equipment can be dropped off at Muchea or Bindoon landfill sites for recycling.

GAS BOTTLES For LPG refills and disposals, return to your bottle supplier. HHW drop off facilities will accept unwanted or out of date BBQ cylinders.

HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES Can be deposited at the landfill facilities for recycling.

NEEDLES Place needles in a sealed sharps container. Visit safesharps.org.au to find your nearest disposal location.

OLD MEDICINES If you have leftover medicines, enquire at your local pharmacy as many pharmacies can dispose of them properly through the RUM project.

PLASTIC BAGS

A good way to avoid plastic bags is by taking your own reusable shopping bags to the shops.

If you wish to recycle plastic bags and other soft or scrunchable plastics, these can be recycled as part of the REDcycle program at local shopping centres. For more info, visit redcycle.net.au

The 3 R's – reduce, reuse and recycle – are a simple way to rethink the things that you no longer need and make a difference today!

EASY TIPS FOR BETTER RECYCLING:



In the **yellow-topped bin** you can place:

Cardboard – Flattened

Glass bottles and jars – Clean and empty

Paper – Not shredded

Plastic bottles and containers – Clean and empty (no lids)

Steel and aluminium cans – Clean and empty

Place items loosely in the bin, this helps with the sorting process at the Regional Resource Recovery Centre (RRRC).

Before placing anything in either bin, ask yourself if it can be reused. It's better to reuse before recycling.



The **red-topped bin** is for general household waste, including kitchen scraps and garden clippings. Alternatively, kitchen scraps and garden clippings can be composted or used in a worm farm at home, keeping valuable resources out of landfill and producing compost that is great for your garden.

Some things should not go in either bin, such as batteries, electronic devices or e-waste, or hazardous household waste. Disposal options for these are given in this calendar.
