NEW LOOK AND NAME FOR SMRC

The Southern Metropolitan Regional Council (SMRC) has recently completed a major rebranding and has a new name – the Resource Recovery Group.

A need for a brand refresh and new name was prompted by a diversifying business and expanding customer base.

"This step has been made to broaden our growth and commitments by helping our customers and partners identify with our brand and value proposition in the broader marketplace," Chairman Cr. Doug Thompson said.

The brand has the strapline: 'Recycle. Innovate. Educate.' to describe the key capabilities of the Resource Recovery Group.

"We **Recycle** materials to their highest practical value; **Innovate** and implement new approaches to recycling and resource recovery; and **Educate** by providing tools to recycle right, reduce waste and live more sustainably," Cr Thompson said.

"The change demonstrates our ongoing vision to maximise material recovery and minimise climate impact by providing best practice resource recovery solutions with high recovery rates and ethical supply chains."

The organisation remains a local government authority constituted under the *Local Government Act 1995 (WA)* with all the good governance that status requires.

The Regional Resource Recovery Centre (RRRC) in Canning Vale will be now referred to as the Resource Recovery Group – Canning Vale Centre.

The SMRC will be trading as the Resource Recovery Group, with changes effective from Wednesday 8 September on every platform. Our new website can be found at

The next step is to get the change endorsed by the Minister for Local Government.

The Resource Recovery Group brand was officially launched at the **WA Waste and Recycling Conference** that was held at Crown Towns from 8-9 September. Staff from the Resource Recovery Group manned a stand that showcased our new brand and also some bags of FOGO-derived compost that is now available for residents to purchase! We also had some of our new Waste education games on display for delegates to test out.

Cloth Nappy Rebate:

City of Melville and Town of East Fremantle residents can apply for a 50% rebate of up to \$100 for either the hire or purchase of cloth nappies.

City of Fremantle residents can apply for a 50% rebate of up to \$150 for either the hire or purchase of cloth nappies.

To be eligible for the rebate, you must first attend a cloth nappy workshop run by The Nappy Guru facilitated by the City of Melville, the City of Fremantle or the Town of East Fremantle.

This is to ensure you have the information and support needed to successfully transition to using cloth nappies. Please bring photo ID with your name and address for proof of residence. The registration fee is \$7.70, with \$5.00 to be refunded to successful cloth nappy rebate applicants on top of the cloth nappy rebate amount.

'Be a G.R.E.A.T. Sort' Waste Education Activities





The Recycle Right team have been busy working with the WMRC waste educators to create a set of education materials/games for schools and the community.

Together we sought to develop an effective community education program that normalises positive waste behaviours and caters to a diverse range of age groups, learning styles and demographics.

The end result is a series of waste education games based on the Waste Sorted "Be a G.R.E.A.T. Sort" campaign. The games can be standalone or used in a school incursion program where up to 400 students rotate through game activity stations in just one day. Each year group's session commences and concludes as a whole group to consolidate student learning and key takeaways.

The activity stations consist of:

- 1. **The GREAT Gifting Game** Gifting unwanted reusable items to charity, swapping, or selling them.
- 2. **The Responsible Recycler Game** Recycling these top five items: paper, cardboard, plastic, glass and aluminium and steel cans.
- 3. **The Excellent Earthcycler Puzzle** Earthcycling food scraps and garden matter into compost
- 4. **The Awesome Avoiders Game** Avoiding excess waste, packaging and disposables
- 5. **The Terrific Taker Relay** Taking batteries, e-waste, and chemicals to special drop-off points.

Two additional activities include:

- 6. **Landfill is the Last Resort Activity** When we throw things away, how long do they take to break down?
- 7. **Containers for Change Game** Players are asked to sort eligible containers accepted for a 10c refund so they can be recycled.

RESOURCES TO HELP YOU TO 'RECYCLE RIGHT'

Our Recycle Right website and App continues to help you—the people of WA—to Recycle Right. Information on both the app and website is tailored to the full assortment of bin systems found in the Perth metropolitan area: 3-bin FOGO (Food Organics, Garden Organics), 3-bin GO (Garden Organics) and 2-bin. Visit recycleright.wa.gov.au/to find out what goes in which bin, access an ever-growing A-Z list of items and what to do with them, Find My Nearest database of drop-off locations and Bin Day Reminders to alert you on your bin days.

The website also provides a Resources Hub of educational worksheets, how-to guides, fact sheets and templates.



WHICH BIN? PLASTIC BOTTLE LIDS

Plastic bottle lids can be recycled BUT not through your yellow-lidded recycling bin. They are too small to be correctly sorted at the Materials Recovery Facilities (MRFs) that process our kerbside recycling and usually end up contaminating the glass. Visit **bit.ly/3joMuvs** to see what happens to your bottle tops if you put them in the recycling bin.

If you would like to see your plastic bottle lids recycled, simply collect them up and drop them off at your local Containers for Change refund point. For more information on recycling your bottle lids through Containers for Change go to bit.ly/30fUDFG

Alternatively, as a last resort, plastic bottle lids can be placed in your general waste bin.
