RECORD WASTE REDUCTION AT THE GEORGE STREET FESTIVAL

This year's George Street Festival had an estimated 10,000+ people in attendance. The Town of East Fremantle were amazed when they undertook the post event audit to discover that a total of only 146Kg of waste was produced! That's equal to six full waste bins which is an incredible result for such a large event!

East Fremantle could not have achieved this result without the help of Go2Cup, a Perth-based family-owned business who work to replace single use items with reusable serveware for food and drink vendors. This year, in partnering with the Town for the George Street Festival, they provided a whopping 18,000 reusable items to the 25 food and beverage vendors on the day.



The Town also provided four different waste streams at the Festival – FOGO (Food & Garden Organics), Recycling, General Waste and Containers for Change – with very little contamination found in the bins.

WHERE DOES OUR FOGO GO?

Last month, the Recycle Right team joined representatives from the Resource Recovery Group, City of Melville, City of Fremantle and Town of East Fremantle on a tour of Go Organics to see how the material from the lime-green lidded FOGO bins is composted.

After the tour, we headed over to a nearby farm in Boonanarring where they are trialling the use of FOGO compost to feed their worm farms and increase soil biodiversity. So great to see the whole process come full circle!

RECYCLING PLASTIC BOTTLE LIDS



This month our Recycle Right Rangers joined the Recycle Right team on a tour of CLAW Environmental in Welshpool. Claw recycle around 2,000 tonnes of rigid plastics and expanded polystyrene every year with roughly 50 tonnes of that made up of the plastic bottle lids recovered through Containers for Change WA refund points. We even got to see some old kerbside recycling bins being shredded before they are pelletised and turned back in to new bins!

If you would like to see your plastic bottle lids recycled drop them to your nearest Containers for Change refund point, or take them along to Bottle Top Hill in Melville or The Recycle InTent in Kalamunda.

RESOURCES TO HELP YOU TO 'RECYCLE RIGHT'

Our Recycle Right website and App continues to help you—the people of WA—to Recycle Right. Information on both the app and website is tailored to the full assortment of bin systems found in the Perth metropolitan area: 3-bin FOGO (Food Organics, Garden Organics), 3-bin GO (Garden Organics) and 2-bin. Visit recycleright.wa.gov. au/ to find out what goes in which bin, access an evergrowing A-Z list of items and what to do with them, Find My Nearest database of drop-off locations and Bin Day Reminders to alert you on your bin days.

The website also provides a Resources Hub of educational worksheets, how-to guides, fact sheets and templates.



WHICH BIN? BATTERIES

The workers at our Materials Recovery Facility remove three of these containers worth of batteries from the recycling every month!

Never place batteries in your household bins. Batteries should always be taken to a drop off centre to be disposed of safely. Batteries pose a significant fire risk potentially endangering truck drivers and staff at recycling facilities if they are put in your household bins.

Use the 'Find My Nearest' tool on the Recycle Right website or app to find your closest drop off centre for batteries and other hazardous waste or head to **bit.ly/3EXONdb** to find out more about the Household Hazardous Waste Program. There's a whole list of items that are free to drop off at 15 permanent facilities across the Perth metro and regional areas.
