


THE WASTE HIERARCHY

WASTE WISE SCHOOLS

Is your School Waste Wise?

The Waste Wise Schools program targets schools in WA with educational strategies for

reducing waste to landfill by implementing the 3Rs, reduce, reuse, recycle - while developing positive environmental values in students and the whole school community.

These schools model responsible environmental behaviours through hands-on learning experiences that are linked to the Australian Curriculum.

Waste Wise Schools is a program of the Waste Authority and offers resources and support for schools to plan, implement and maintain waste minimising projects such as recycling, composting and worm farming.

The program helps schools to set up infrastructure and provides resources aimed at changing attitudes and behaviour in regard to sustainable waste management.

The program is FREE and available to all schools in Western Australia.

FREE COMPOSTABLE BIN BAGS

We are currently trialling compostable bin liners and compostable re-useable shopping bags that SMRC residents can use in their home to reduce the amount of plastic in the green-topped bin. Plastic cannot be composted and needs to be screened out, so it's best to use compostable liners. Each tour participant gets a **free sample** when they come and see what happens to their waste!

MANAGING YOUR BINS IN WINTER

Winter is coming fast and your bin is likely to be less smelly, though more likely to collect water. It is important to make sure your bin lid is closed properly at all times, including collection day.

Water in your bin causes your waste to weigh more, so the trucks fill up faster than they would if your waste is nice and dry. If you have a crack in the lid of either of your bins, contact your Council to have the bin lid replaced.
