Bin Collection Information



Ensure bins are placed out by 6am on collection day



Bins must weigh less than 70kg to be collected



Do not overfill your bins and ensure lids are firmly closed so items do not spill out



Place bins away from other objects with the front facing the street.



Which Bin Do I Put It In?

FOGO – Collected weekly



Your Food Organics, Garden Organics Bin is for:

- All food waste: including fruit and vegetable scraps, breads, grains, cooked food, leftovers, meat, bones, dairy and seafood
- ✓ Tea bags and coffee grounds
- ✓ Compostable liners
- ✓ Garden waste: Lawn clippings, branches, flowers, weeds and leaves
- ✓ Animal waste: Kitty litter and dog poo
- Dirty Takeaway Paper and Cardboard: including greasy pizza boxes, paper bags and paper plates
- ✓ Shredded paper
- ✓ Tissues, napkins and paper towels
- ✓ Wooden pop sticks and cutlery

Green 8L compostable liners are available at major supermarkets and hardware stores.



Only use the compostable liners with these symbols in your FOGO bin as other liners do not break down in the composting process. Alternatively, line your caddy with newspaper, or put food waste in without a liner.





These items don't belong in the FOGO bin:



NO construction & demolition waste



NO general waste



NO hazardous waste



NO plant pots



NO plastic bags or liners



NO recyclables (plastics, glass & metals)

Apartments or strata properties with more than 4 units are generally not included in the June 2022 FOGO rollout. The Town will gradually transition apartment complexes over to FOGO. Please continue to use your bins as before. If your complex wishes to change to the FOGO system, please email **town@cottesloe.wa.gov.au**. Otherwise, the Town will make contact and supply kitchen caddies when your complex is 'Good to FOGO'.

Recycling Bin – Collected fortnightly



Your **Recycling Bin** is for:

- Clean paper & cardboard
- ✓ Glass bottles & jars
- ✓ Plastic bottles & containers
- ✓ Steel & aluminium cans

Please ensure all recycling is clean, dry, empty with all lids removed and placed loose into the bin and not in bags

- × NO recycling in bags
- X NO soft plastics*
- X NO aerosols
- X NO batteries or E-Waste
- NO broken toys, crates, buckets or coat hangers
- ✗ NO meat trays
- ✗ NO nappies
- × NO textiles

General Waste Bin – Collected fortnightly



Your **General Waste Bin** is for all general rubbish items, such as:

- ✓ Ceramics
- ✓ Cigarette butts
- ✓ Coffee cups and coffee pods
- ✓ Damaged textiles (including shoes)
- ✓ Long life cartons (Tetra Pak)
- ✓ Meat trays and packaging
- ✓ Nappies, hygiene products and wipes
- ✓ Pill packets
- ✓ Plastic bottle lids
- ✓ Polystyrene packaging
- ✓ Soft plastics* (bags, packets and wrappers)

- × NO clean recyclables
- × NO hazardous waste

Household Hazardous Waste and E-waste shouldn't be placed in any bins. Drop this waste off to the West Metro Recycling Centre free of charge.

Containers for Change



Whether you're keen to earn a bit of extra cash, raise money for your local sports club or event, or donate to your favourite charity, earn 10 cents for every eligible drink container collected.

All drink containers returned through the scheme are recycled into new items such as glass bottles.

What's in? Acceptable beverage containers include most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paper board between 150ml and 3 litres. You can recycle lids from these containers too, remember to remove them first!

Soft Plastics

Soft 'scrunchable' plastics are plastic bags and food packaging that can be scrunched into a ball and expand immediately - think chip packets, chocolate wrappers and cereal bags. These can't be recycled in your recycling bin because they are too lightweight and get mixed up with the paper stream. Collect your soft plastics separately and drop them into a REDcycle bin at the front of your local supermarket. For more information about what is considered a soft plastic, visit www.redcycle.net.au

Soft plastics are more than plastic bags. Did you know these items are accepted by REDcycle?

- Bubble wrap
- · Cellophane from bunches of flowers
- Chip and cracker packets (silver lined)
- Confectionery and pasta bags
- Netting produce bags (metal clips removed)
- Pet food pouches and bags
- Plastic Australia Post satchels
- Potting mix and compost bags
- Squeeze pouches with lid on (e.g. yoghurt/baby food)

How To Be A GREAT Sort!

Sort first and treat your general waste bin as a last resort.

G = GIFT Gift items to charity, swap or sell.

R = RECYCLE Recycle **these 5** in your yellow lidded bin – paper, cans, cardboard,

plastic and glass - rinsed, loose, lids off.











E = EARTHCYCLE Compost food scraps and garden waste. Worm Farming and Composting Factsheets available at **wmrc.wa.gov.au**

A = AVOID Avoid single use items, excess packaging and waste. Find out how at

Verge Valet Collections

Verge Valet™, as easy as 1, 2, 3...

- 1. Book online at vergevalet.com.au
- 2. Receive confirmation or text message reminder about your collection from Verge Valet™.
- 3. Place accepted items out 1 to 3 days before your collection date.

Leave the rest to us - easy as that.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I book Verge Valet™?

Book online through the Verge Valet[™] website: **vergevalet.com.au** If you're having trouble, call the Verge Valet[™] and Recycling Hotline team on 93846711.

How far in advance do I need to book?

You can book up to 8 weeks in advance of your preferred collection date. Bookings can be made a minimum of 4 days before your collection. We recommend you book early to secure your preferred collection date. Collections are scheduled weekly on Monday in Cottesloe (excluding public holidays). Remember to book your collection first before placing any waste out. Waste can only be placed out 3 days before your collection.


When can I place my waste out?

After you book and 1 to 3 days before your collection. You will receive a confirmation text message 3 days before your collection. Penalties apply to waste placed out more than 3 days prior to collection.

How many collections do I get a year?



1 Green Waste collection



You can change any of your bulk waste collections into green waste if you prefer

What won't be accepted?

Asbestos, batteries, building materials, household hazardous waste, glass panels, pesticides, paint and vehicle parts. Drop these items off at the West Metro Recycling Centre 7 days a week – some are free and some for a fee.



How can I change or cancel my booking?

You can change, cancel, or postpone your booking up to one business day before your collection date. Click CHANGE A BOOKING on **vergevalet.com.au** or phone WMRC on 9384 6711. Please give at least one business days' notice or you will lose your collection allocation.

What happens to the waste collected by Verge Valet™?

Neat piles of separated waste help us recycle as much as we can. We reprocess all the greenwaste and recover as much recyclable material from bulk waste as possible. Mattresses, e-waste and white goods are recycled by specialists and fridges etc. are safely de-gassed.


Verge Valet™ is intended for items that can no longer be used. Donate items that are too good to be thrown away.

I live in an apartment complex, how do I get Verge Valet™?

Apartment complexes with more than 25 units must have their VergeValet $^{\rm IM}$ collections organised through the strata manager, building manager or caretaker via a separate booking process found on the website. Collections can only be booked for the first Monday of the month. If you live in an apartment with 25 units or less, book your collection yourself at **vergevalet.com.au**.

What can I put out for a Verge Valet™ collection?

Place items in separate piles to maximise what can be recycled. Remember, limit of 3m³ per collection.
