CONTAINERS FOR CHANGE SCHEME LAUNCHED!

Whether you're keen to earn a bit of extra cash, raise money for your local sports club or even donate to your favourite charity, you can now start earning 10-cents for every eligible drink container collected for the Containers for Change scheme. Eligible containers include most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paperboard beverage containers which are typically consumed outside the home. The introduction of container deposits schemes in other states have resulted in a dramatic reduction in litter and a huge increase in recycling rates. In WA over 1 million containers were returned through the program on the first day!

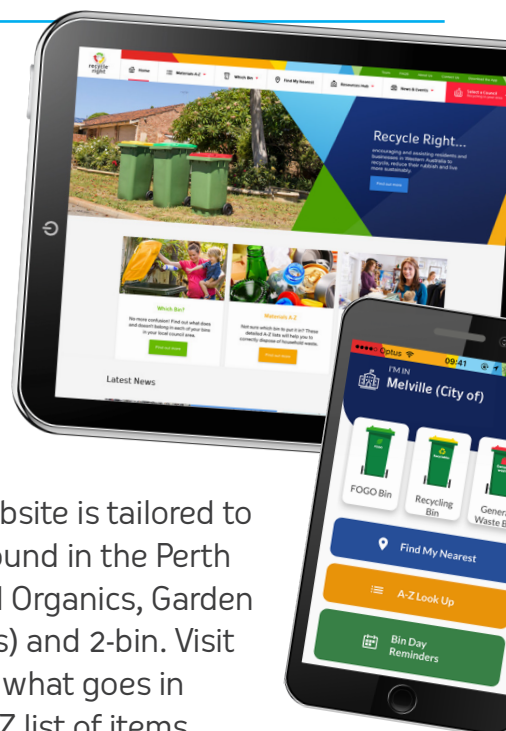

WHICH BIN? TIPS TO HELP YOU TO RECYCLE RIGHT

Overwhelmingly soft plastics are one of the most common sources of contamination we are currently seeing in recycling bins across Perth.

Save your soft plastics from ending up in landfill or contaminating our recycling streams by collecting them up and dropping them off at a REDcycle bin in front of your local Coles or Woolworths.

If you can't take your soft plastics to be REDCycled then please place them in your General Waste bin.
