

Can you believe...

...what some people put into their bins?

During June, the Regional Resource Recovery Centre received this large trolley jack, which was delivered to the Waste Composting Facility having been collected from someone's general waste bin. The jack ended up causing problems with the machinery, resulting in damage and downtime at the facility.

The incident acts as a reminder to make sure you carefully consider what sort of items you are placing into your bins, as many items shouldn't be placed into either of your bins as they are dangerous to collect, transport and process.

Batteries

Batteries should never be placed in your kerbside bins, as they contain toxic chemicals and heavy metals that leach into the environment when they go into landfill. All batteries can be disposed of at your nearest battery disposal centre.



Car batteries can usually be taken back to the retailer or mechanic that sold you a new battery. Returned car batteries are collected and processed through specialist battery recycling centres. Car batteries are 98 per cent recyclable and can be used to build more batteries and household products such as detergents and plastic bins.
